Fayetteville Regional Airport

Three major airlines fly out of the airport, which services twelve local Sandhills counties. For an airport of this size, it has a rather high volume of flights and passengers. Despite this, the Airport has taken the initiative to reduce their environmental impact and follow more sustainable practices.

Along with requirements for storm water and hazardous waste disposal, the Fayetteville Regional Airport utilizes green cleaning supplies, provides numerous recycling receptacles in public areas, and even keeps outdoor smoking areas and cigarette butt receptacles looking neat.



When remodeling, the personnel at the airport used low Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) paints and supplies. They have converted their lighting to high efficiency fluorescents and their Exit signs to LEDs, which are both more cost and energy efficient forms of lighting. Appliances are Energy Star rated, and timers are placed on electronics that are not used that often.
